

What is Papercraft ?

The art of hand making decorative cards using a variety of techniques.

Our very talented teacher Leyla, is highly skilled in card making and other artistic, craft techniques.

When are the classes ?

This class is available to new students every school term.

Students attend a 2 and a half hour class weekly for one term, which is approximately 10 weeks.

The vision of The Junction Neighbourhood Centre is to contribute to and be part of a community that works together for justice, reconciliation, fairness, acceptance & tolerance for all.

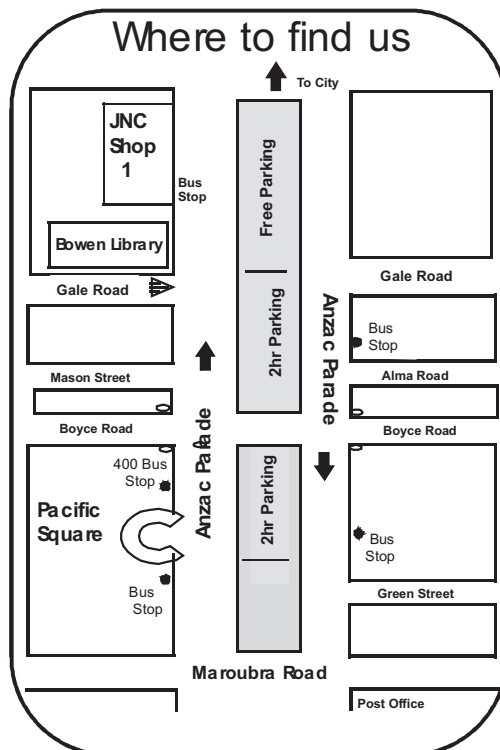
We strive to provide responsive and meaningful services to meet identified community needs and seek to develop community participation in the development of these services.
